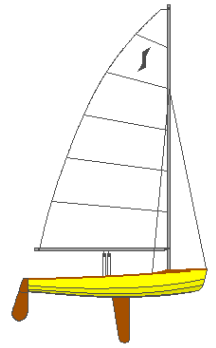

Introduction

Happy New Year to each & every member of the Solo Fleet, whether you are a regular, occasional or even more occasional sailor!

Sadly most of us were only occasional sailors for the start of this Winter Series, with many days or half days lost through no wind or ice, but things are getting back to normal now and we had 14 Solos out for the afternoon race on Sunday 23rd January – which must be a fleet record for January!

Prize Giving Dinner

This will be on Friday 18th March, with things starting at 7pm and dinner served at 7.30pm. It will be at the Club, again combined with our friends in the Miracle fleet. The cost will be £14 per head, £7.50 for under 14s. There is a choice of 3 main courses and 3 puddings, which you have to choose in advance.

Mains

Braised beef bourguignonne

(Marinated in red wine & juniper berries & cooked slowly with shallots, lardoons of bacon and mushrooms served with a rich gravy & finished with a heart shaped crouton)

Chicken breast

(A breast of chicken pan fried with sweet potato, lardoons of bacon and butternut squash served with a creamy mushroom sauce & topped with toasted pine nuts)

Roasted vegetable potato cake

(Swede, peppers, courgette & red onion roasted & mixed with grated potato & garlic, pan fried & topped with mature cheddar & fresh pesto)

All served with vegetables and potatoes

(Buttered new potatoes, julienne of carrot glaze, broccoli florest, petit pois)

Puddings

Rhubarb & ginger crumble served with custard

Chocolate brownie served with ice cream and hot chocolate sauce

Tropical fresh fruit salad with pouring cream

I hope we will again get a great turnout for what is a good evening for fleet members and their partners to socialise, whether or not you are there to pick up a prize. But quite a few are, with the roll of honour being:

Calendar

A big thank you to Sue McCrea for the fabulous “proper” calendar she has once again produced for the fleet. 18 of these were sold and made a small surplus for fleet funds. We put as many events as had been arranged on this, but, enclosed with this newsletter you will find the latest calendar for the Draycote Solo Fleet. Unfortunately the dates for the Interfleet Championships and Draycote Dash are only provisional.

Please note that our Open Meeting is much earlier in the year than usual – Saturday 7th May. We had a disappointing turnout from the home fleet for this last year and I am hoping that this new date will prove better.

Please make a note of all dates and, in particular, can I highlight:

- Saturday 30th April: Fleet trip round the Long Itchington Beer Festival
- Saturday 7th May: Draycote Solo Open Meeting
- Saturday 4th June: Training Day (of which more later)
- Sunday 3rd July: Interfleet Championships (Provisional)
- Saturday 9th July: Fleet BBQ
- Sunday 10th July: Handicap Pursuit Races

Last year a few of us made it round the Long Itchington Beer Festival (1 Village, 4 days, 6 pubs) and it is proposed to repeat that this year on the Saturday evening (30th April). If you are interested, let me know and we can arrange where to meet up so start the tour! (The landlords assure me they do not intend to run out of beer this year!).

This year we will be reciprocating with the Fireball Fleet over open meetings, so will be “on duty” for their open in September. I will send out another newsletter in May reminding you of the events in June & July, but please make a note of them for now. The most immediate of these is:

Training Day

At the AGM there was some enthusiasm for repeating the training day run by the fleet, as we did last year. This has been scheduled for Saturday 4th June and I will run it, hopefully with the help of some front of the fleet sailors.

As last year, this will be very much tailored to what those attending want to do, but I anticipate it being mainly on the water, but with some off the water, including, if possible, filming some of the sailing and playing it back later. There will be a small fee (£10) to cover the cost of the coaching boat.

Fleet Annual General Meeting

At the fleet's Annual General Meeting in December, you kindly elected me as Fleet Captain for another year, despite some opposition (from my wife!). I understand a rival meeting of 2 fleet members (Dave Eales & Jon Clarke) on the same day, but in Cuba, failed to elect anyone else, so you've got me for another year!

After many years, Mike Partington retired as Fleet Treasurer and Andrew Smith was elected in his place. I would like to thank Mike for his many years working for the fleet in this (and other) roles.

The only change that was introduced at the AGM is that the Fleet Championships will now have 3 races to count. It will still be held over 2 weekends (i.e. a maximum of 6 races), but only 3 will count to the scores, meaning that those attending just 1 day now have much more of a chance of winning.

Revised details of our series and scoring (taking into account this change) will be published on the Solo pages of the Club website and put on the fleet notice board.

Winter Series

The Winter Series is now just over half way through. As I mentioned earlier, it has started off fairly slowly, with many races missed, but still we had 4 different people winning the first 4 races.

Robin Warren took the lead on 2nd January, but I reclaimed it the following weekend after an excellent day's racing with a good fleet out. Robin has kept second place, and Lance Evans is third, but Nigel Davies has started turning up and winning races, so none of us are safe! The results can be found on the Solo fleet pages of the club website, but top 12 at the moment (up to and including 30th January) are as follows:
